One of the popular inventories for assessing sensory processing is the Sensory Profile (), which is based on Dunn's (1997) model of sensory processing. According to this model, people are characterized by their positioning on four major types of sensory processing, defined according to two axes: the response threshold of the nervous system (high/low) and the strategy of response (passive/active).
